How we will help people who have lived in care	
In 2018 we published a plan that said how we would support people who have lived in care.	
We will continue to do the things we said we would do in that plan.	
That includes caring like a parent would.	
People who have lived in care often have less opportunity in education, training and work.	



We think helping them will change this.	X V
We will work with Centre for Excellence for Looked after Children In Scotland (CELCIS), Who Cares? Scotland and the Scottish Throughcare and Aftercare Forum (STAF) to do this.	CELCIS
We have already started doing this.

We will do it in two ways.	
First, we will produce a computer-based programme that guides people who have lived in care through our services.	Support Plan
This will help them see how we can help them learn and work.

Second, we will find out if we need to do anything to better support people who have lived in care.	
This might be, for example, when they get exam results or are moving from school to work.	
We think this will help more of them to get the career they want.

How we will help people from ethnic minority communities	
We will work with local and national groups who support people from ethnic minority communities.	
This will include people who are refugees, asylum seekers or who are Gypsies or travellers.	#WeHaveRoom
