

Gender

The percentage of MAs who are female in Dumfries & Galloway does not compare favourably with the national rate (31.2% for Dumfries & Galloway, 39.8% for Scotland). Females are under-represented in Modern Apprenticeships when compared to the percentage of females aged 16-24 employed in Dumfries & Galloway (31.2% / 45.8% respectively). The proportion of female starts in STEM frameworks in Dumfries & Galloway is 6.3%, lower than the national figure of 6.6%






Disability








Ethnicity

The percentage of MA starts who self-identify being from a Mixed or Multiple; Asian; African; Caribbean or Black; and Other ethnic group in Dumfries & Galloway is 0.8%. 


