National CIAG Education team: Professional learning offer 2023/24


Supporting teachers, other practitioners, parents and a range of partners across Scotland to play their complementary roles in delivering young people's entitlement to a meaningful career education

Our professional learning offer for schools consists of a range of workshops that introduce career education, explore why it matters and the benefits it brings to young people and practitioners.

Workshops themes include: Career Education, Skills, Labour Market Information (LMI), Career Management Skills (CMS), My World of Work (MyWoW) and Developing the Young Workforce (DYW).

All workshops provide practical approaches to help integrate career education into day-to-day learning and support teachers and other practitioners to do this in a proportionate and manageable way.

They can be offered in a standard format or tailored to better reflect schools progress and needs; either as a single event or as part of an extended programme.

- Provides options for progression within and across themes
- Facilitates professional dialogue through interactive and engaging activities
- Can be delivered face-to-face, live online or as e-learning with the option of a live follow-up workshop

Career Education	Introduction to career education: This workshop introduces career education, sets it in context and explores the benefits that it brings to schools and learners. 	Introduction to career education and self-evaluation: Supports schools to reflect on their progress and identify next steps using a self-evaluation tool. It provides schools with a baseline for future benchmarking, aids familiarisation, helps identify and share effective practice and supports planning for improvement.	Face-to-face Live online
Skills	Embedding skills: Provides a focus on future employability skills, their importance to learners and how these can be integrated into everyday classroom practice in a pragmatic and sustainable way.	Face-to-face Live online E-learning
