SDS facilitated professional learning workshops



Our suite of SDS facilitated professional learning workshops support education practitioners by providing practical approaches to embedding career education into day-to-day learning and in a proportionate and manageable way. They can be offered to all staff, leadership teams and working groups in a standard format or tailored to better reflect your establishment's progress and needs; either as a single event or as part of an extended programme.

	CES introduction and self-evaluation: a structured hands-on approach workshop that allows educators to reflect on their progress and identify next steps using the CES self-evaluation resource. It provides education settings with a CES baseline for future benchmarking, aids familiarisation, helps identify and share effective practice and supports planning for improvement.	90 mins	In person
Skills	Introduction to meta-skills: an interactive workshop providing a more focussed look at the Skills 4.0 meta-skills framework and how these can be integrated into everyday classroom practice.	60 mins	In person or virtual
	Embedding skills: an interactive workshop exploring what future skills are, their importance to learners and how these can be embedded into everyday classroom practice in a pragmatic and sustainable way.	60 mins	In person or virtual
	Embedding skills audit: a structured hands-on approach for schools to reflect on how skills are being embedded and identify next steps using the skills audit toolkit. Completion of the tool will provide the education setting with a skills baseline for future benchmarking, aids familiarisation, helps identify and share effective practice and supports planning for improvement.	90 mins	In person
LMI	Introduction to labour market information (LMI): An interactive workshop that explores what LMI is, shares examples of online sources where it can be found and provides examples of how practitioners can manageably integrate it into everyday classroom practice.	60 mins	In person or virtual
CMS	Understanding career management skills (CMS): an interactive workshop that introduces CMS, considers how these competencies are already part of day-to-day learning and teaching and explores practical approaches to further develop young people's CMS as an integral part of the curriculum.	60 mins	In person or virtual



Self-directed professional learning activities




