

# Privacy Notice National Transition Training Fund

#### Who are we?

The Skills Development Scotland Co Ltd ("SDS", "we", or "us") is the national skills body supporting the people and businesses of Scotland to develop and apply their skills.

### **National Transition Training Fund (NTTF)**

NTTF includes the following initiatives:

- Seafood Business Improvement Programme, which has been designed to have a significant impact on the sector by raising skill levels within businesses. This programme of activity will deliver much needed upskilling/reskilling to workers in Scotland's seafood onshore sectors. This Business Improvement Programme has alignment to the Scotland Food & Drink Sector Recovery Plan, that focusses on supporting the wider sector to address its s challenges.
- Creative Industries Freelance Workforce Recovery Programme, which supports creative freelance workers who live in Scotland and are aged 25 or older, providing them with upskilling and reskilling opportunities to mitigate the impacts of the pandemic.
- The Tourism and Hospitality Talent Development programme, which delivers a programme of online management, leadership and supervisory training for employees within the tourism and hospitality sector;
- Climate Emergency Skills Action Plan (CESAP) sets out how Scotland will
  capitalise on job opportunities emerging from the net zero transition and the
  declaration of a climate emergency. The CESAP identifies a series of priority
  areas focused on employers, education and individuals that will help Scotland
  capitalise on job opportunities emerging from the net-zero transition.

# Who is this Privacy Statement for?

This Privacy Statement provides privacy information to individuals partaking in the programmes that are part of NTTF and as listed above - how their personal data will be processed, shared and stored.

What personal information do we collect and process?

As part of NTTF, SDS may collect:

- Your name and contact details
- Data relating to eligibility requirements for the particular programme/funding you are applying for
- Equalities information (this is not mandatory and we will only report on this anonymously)

Training providers who are contracted to deliver NTTF will collect this data from yourself, and will then share it with SDS.

## When might we share your information?

The information collected shall be held by us or on our behalf and may be passed by us to other public bodies concerned with one or more of the following:

- economic development
- skills development
- awards for vocational qualifications
- · maintaining educational standards
- the provision of other public services or benefits
- our internal/external auditors in each case, to the extent required to fulfil their respective public functions.

Your information will also be shared with your training provider, given that they initially collect this information from you and that they deliver the programme/training to you.

The information you provide to us about aspects such as your ethnicity and religion in the Equality Monitoring Form will be passed to Scottish Government as we are required to report on this information under the Equality Act (2010).

Your contact information may be shared with contracted external organisations for the purpose of carrying out surveys and evaluations on behalf of SDS. They will only use your data for this purpose and will not share it further with any other parties.

# How do we protect your information?

Skills Development Scotland maintain a high standard of both physical and network security designed to protect paper or electronic forms of storage to hold and process your personal information.

Information that we hold about you will be subject to rigorous safeguards to ensure that it isn't accessed or disclosed inappropriately. We also take steps to ensure that your information is not damaged or rendered unavailable to those who have a right to see it.

To meet confidentiality requirements for our customers, stakeholders, and staff, Skills Development Scotland has Confidentiality, Data Protection and Information Technology notices in place and we ensure that staff are fully aware of these and the associated guidance in relation to your personal information. These also apply when we dispose of paper records and delete electronic information in ways that ensure that your information cannot be recreated.

# How long do we store your information?

We will retain your personal information for four years following the completion of your training, for the purposes of monitoring, auditing and compliance checks, as well as getting in touch with you for survey and evaluation purposes.

## **Your Rights**
